College Students: Need Help Paying for Groceries?

If you are a student ages 18–49 attending a college/university temporary eligibility criteria mean you are much more likely to qualify for SNAP benefits (income eligibility and other requirements may still apply)

PERSONS	MONTHLY INCOME LIMIT	MAXIMUM BENEFIT
One	\$1,473	\$281
Two	\$1,984	\$516
Three	\$2,495	\$740

TEMPORARY ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA | You must also meet at least **one** additional criterion listed below:

- 1. Are *eligible* to participate in state or federally financed work study during the regular school year. The institution of higher education (i.e., the college or university) determines if a student is considered *eligible* for work study.
- 2. Have an Expected Family Contribution (EFC) of 0 in the current academic year. Students receive an EFC after applying for financial aid.

These criteria apply until 30 days after the federal government officially lifts the national COVID-19 public health emergency, after which eligibility requirements become more stringent
